Guest Speaker; Louise Lemon – Days for Girls

- International Organisation that provides feminine hygiene products for girls in developing countries and indigenous communities in Australia.
- Girls lose:
 - days from school
 - days from work
 - time with family and friends
 - their dignityand are humiliated because of lack of something to use
- Days for Girls provide kits, the contents of which are washable and will last for up to three years. The kits contain, 2 waterproof shields, 8 liners, 2 pairs of undies, 1 washer and soap and a drawstring bag.
- The Club could contribute by;
 - Sewing and providing other products for complete kits
 - Sewing shields, liners and/or bags and giving to Days for Girls to be packed with their kits.
 - Purchasing fabric, undies or washers.
 - Donating money
- If the Club produces whole kits, it can choose where to send the kits but would be responsible for getting them there. If sent to Days for Girls, they decide where they go and provide transport.
